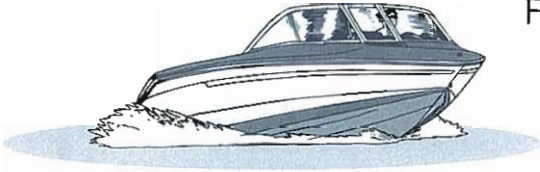

THE GREAT RACE

Also, we will have just completed the Athens' Olympics, with all the individual and team "great races" that you could possibly want. Hope you have some fun with this one - I know we spectators will!

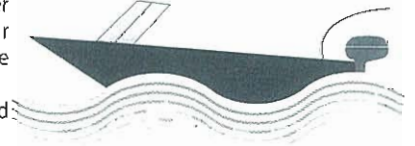


BRIEF HISTORY OF THE CAMPBELL REGATTA

When we bought Campbell Boats in the early 70's there were 7500 people in a town that has now grown to over 50,000. Since we were then unacquainted with many of the owners of Campbell boats as they lived in California, Nevada, etc., Bob decided to host a Regatta so we could meet our owners. Of course it was a very low-key event, but the owners were enthusiastic and had lots of ideas for future Regattas. Taking their suggestions, we gradually added a dinner and dance, the boat parade, the competitive events, etc. until it evolved into the event it is today.

Now almost every summer and fall weekend brings a boat regatta to Havasu, but the Campbell Regatta is still unique. Ours is the only Regatta actually put on by the people who used to manufacture, and now refurbish and maintain, those original Campbell Boats. All other Regattas are put on by a paid promoter. Even more unique is the fact that we are the only Regatta allowed to have competitive boat races. Other boat regattas have copied our boat parade, poker run, etc., but only Campbell is allowed to conduct races, even in the area that is now a no-wake zone.

And, most important, we are unique in having owners who bring their own new events to our Regatta, such as Saturday's carne asada buffet that feeds all participants and crew, and the traditional up-river get together on Sunday afternoon. Our Regatta is unique, and for sure our Campbell owners are! We'll do it all again for the 32nd year on September 10-12.



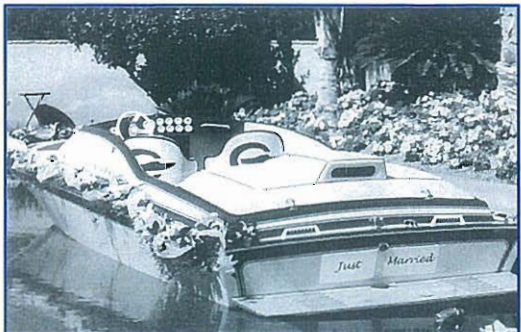
SEE YOU THERE!
