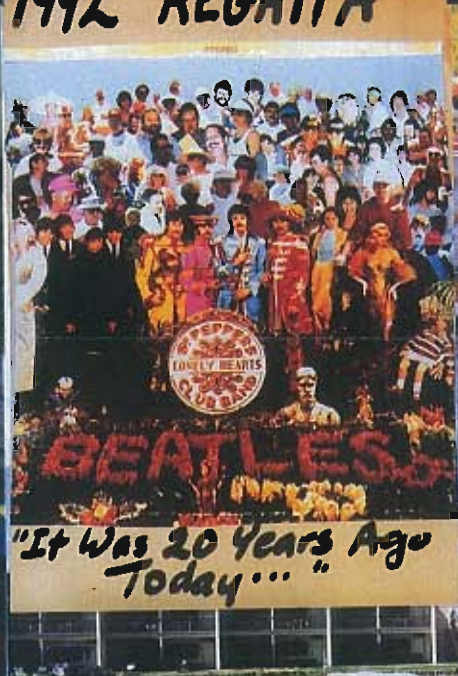
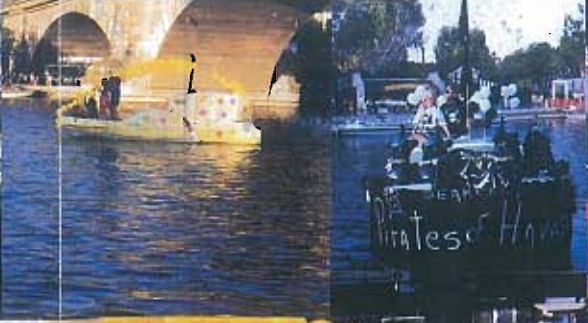
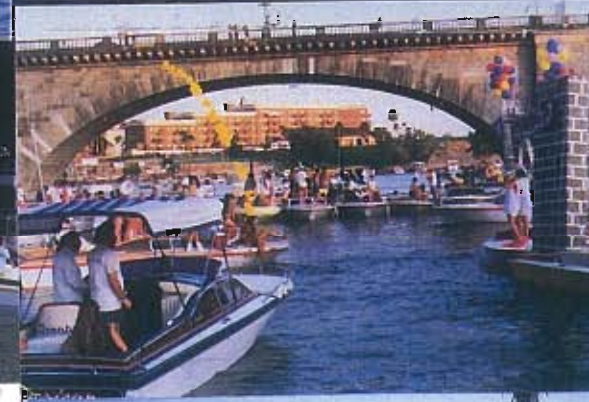
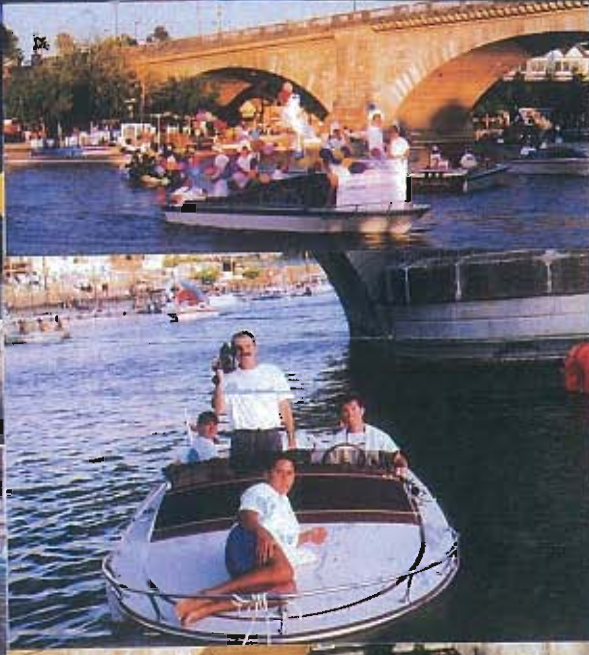
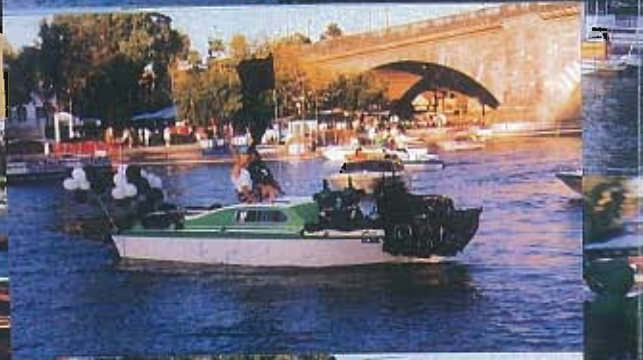


Bob pours champagne for Michael Willis from Monrovia, who is taking delivery of his beautiful emerald 22' daycruiser, TIMELESS.
